Each day I drive down Hillsdale Blvd and see the Oracle towers in the distance, I am reminded that we live in the most dynamic, tech-rich community in the world. Unfortunately California's funding model has not provided the resources necessary to equip our students with the technology that has been proven to boost engagement and critical thinking in the classroom. A few years ago, Hillsdale hosted a visitation by Tennessee school educators who expressed their amazement at the lack of computers in California schools. Over the past several years, our district has made progress in providing additional resources, but we still have a huge gap to fill.

The Hillsdale High School Foundation has stepped in this past year to provide funding for game-changing technology on our campus. The result of donations from both families and alumni can be seen in Room 428: 36 new lap-tops has made possible the addition of a class-section of Digital Photography and three class sections of Computer Science, a new program at Hillsdale. We are partnering with Technology Education and Literacy in Schools (TEALS) to bring this valuable opportunity to our students, and math teacher Kevin McAnerney is leading the design of the new program.

Thanks to the Foundation's support over 100 students are taking "Principles of Computer Science" in our inaugural year! In addition to funding the computers, the Foundation helped recruit three volunteers from the Hillsdale community to co-teach the course: Jon Neil, Christopher Hogan and Jonathan McEvoy. They bring industry expertise from Invidia, Google and the gaming industry into the classroom to help our students learn to code and be exposed to many facets of the Computer Science Industry.

The class is based upon the course "The Beauty and Joy of Computing" which is endorsed by the College Board and code.org and offered at U.C. Berkeley. The focus is developing sound programming practices using SNAP & Python programming languages, as well as addressing social issues around computing such as privacy, the digital divide, cryptography and much more. Students in this course will be eligible to take the Principles of Computer Science AP test, which is scheduled to be offered in 2016/17.

The goal of the program goes beyond just learning how to code. Its intent is to close the equity gap in computing, and get under-represented groups involved in the field. Expanding the program in the future could incorporate offering an AP JavaScript course and teacher training on how to incorporate coding into all our classes.

But what is really exciting about creating an expansive Computer Science program at Hillsdale is the potential to incorporate computer science principles and skills in all our courses. Imagine a physics class where students learn to code projectile motion, math courses that teach coordinates through coding, or social science classes that analyze data using computational thinking. Further support from the foundation can help realize the development of these courses and the teacher training required to incorporate these essential 21st century skills in every classroom.

The Foundation is excited to help Hillsdale take the first step in creating an educational experience in which all students gain core computer science skills across their entire curriculum.

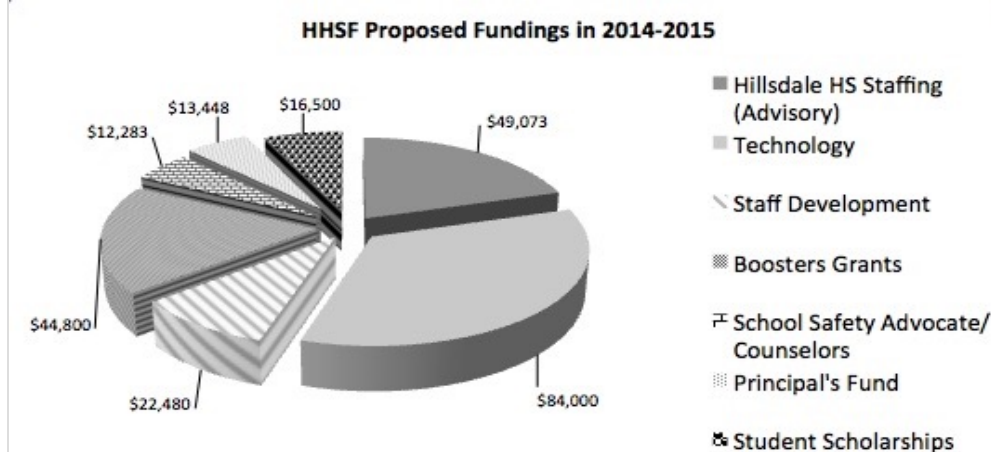
is proud to be a committee of the Hillsdale HS Foundation and to have demonstrated our continuing support for today's Hillsdale students by donating \$40,500 this past year.
